Go behind the scenes at the Hampshire Cultural Trust and learn about their impressive collections. Come and meet the Mayor of Winchester in her official home at

the Abbey House Open Day and get a glimpse of a Regency ballroom on a guided tour of St John's Assembly Rooms. Further afield, the IBM Museum at Hursley House will appeal to computer buffs... but did you know the building was also once home to the team behind the Spitfire?

Winchester Quaker Meeting House, meet Regency dancers and Tudor musicians at The Great Hall and book in to one of the many storytelling sessions around the city.

OUT AND ABOUT



and **Bullington Village Fete**. In Alresford you will find a **Norman Bridge** and an **Eel House** and you can book a guided tour of **The Grange** at Northington, a 'roofed' ruin of one of the earliest Greek revival houses in Europe.

Built to defend Southampton from attack 700 years ago, it will become the city's newest arts and heritage venue.
